### CAP Grants 2004-05

Fourteen branches of the Palliser Regional Library received \$34,200 from Industry Canada to assist with public access programming from April 15, 2004 to March 31, 2005. These branches were Assiniboia, Avonlea, Craik, Coronach, Davidson, Elbow, Holdfast, Imperial, Loreburn, Moose Jaw, Mossbank, Riverhurst, Rockglen and Tugaske. Branches have used these funds to offer public computer courses, to cover SaskTel Internet connections costs, and to purchase furniture for the public access stations. A 2-day staff training workshop was held in March of 2005. Regrettably, many of smallest branches did not qualify for funding. Mortlach, Wood Mountain, and Briercrest will be receiving assistance re: telecommunications costs from the equalization refund structure set-up under CommunityNet. Rouleau, Willow Bunch and Bethune are already receiving direct telecommunications assistance from CommunityNet.

### CAP Grants 2005-06

The fourteen aforementioned branches received an additional \$36,200 from Industry Canada to assist with public access from April 15, 2005 to March 31, 2006. We will be purchasing new equipment for the branches with these funds. In 2005, several towns and villages had high speed microwave internet made available through the SaskTel CommunityNet II program. The setup cost of \$450 per site for the receiver and other equipment was covered by CAP. A 2-day staff training workshop was held in March of 2006. Wherever possible, branches have used the remaining funds to offer public computer courses.

The CAP programming is officially "sun setting" in 2007 but we are hopeful that the federal government will continue to recognize the importance that libraries play in offering public access and their need for assistance to continue to provide this free access to all citizens and foreign travellers. Letters have been written to our 6 federal Members of Parliament indicating our need for the continuance of a program similar to CAP. Jan Smith had profitable meetings with Ed Komarnicki (Souris Moose Mountain) and Ed Lukiwski (Regina Beach-Lumsden –Last Mountain Lake) where Question Period questions were drafted and the issue was placed on the Conservative Election Platform by Mr. Lukiwski.

### Young Canada Works Internship

Thanks to the Minister of Heritage, Palliser has received a grant of \$8,000 to be used towards the hiring of a recent graduate, Arwen Rudolph of Gull Lake, to assist in the public training and marketing of our online databases. She started at Headquarters on October 3<sup>rd</sup> and will complete her internship on March 31, 2006. During her term she has developed several hand-outs and given public training sessions throughout the region.

We would like to extend many thanks to **Lt. Governor Linda Haverstock** and her staff for all their work and efforts in making the authors available to the libraries of the province.

### Regional Highlights

The **PROVINCIAL GATEWAY** was launched at Moose Jaw Public Library on October 20, 2005.

**Moose Jaw Inventory Completed!** The staff of Moose Jaw Public Library has been working on the smaller collections while engaging in a weeding process.

**Moose Jaw Archives Project:** **Dorothy Lazaruko** was hired part time through a Canadian Council of Archives grant in conjunction with funding from the **Moose Jaw Friends of the Library** to continue the work on cataloguing the collection.

**Headquarters Archive Project:** **Chantal Banelevic**, our summer student, worked on indexing and reorganizing the massive amounts of paper residing at Headquarters. Many thanks to **Dorothy Lazaruko** for teaching Chantal how to index and organize the collection as well as with providing on-call guidance and advice during her 6 week summer work grant.

**Coronach's Flood:** The library experienced some minor flooding after several days of rain in May of 2005. Several boxes of books were lost but the equipment made it through. The building has since been fixed and earth has been banked on the side next to the slope from gas station to reroute the rain water away from the building.

- ▶ **Online Catalogues** - Visit the **IPAC** Icon and place holds on books, CD's, DVD's, cake pans, etc. You can also use our link to renew (one time per item) your materials online. Visit the **Gateway** icon to see what is available in the rest of the public libraries in the Province.
- ▶ **On-line help** – Its 10:00 p.m. and you need to use the Gateway but you really don't want to wake your friendly librarian up? Click on "How to use the Gateway" for a PowerPoint presentation.

## **BRANCHES ON COMMUNITYNET II (Satellite-Tower Relay High Speed)**

High speed internet access through the CommunityNet II satellite network has become available in the communities of Elbow, Loreburn and Tugaska. Installation date for Avonlea is set for the spring of 2006. On September 23<sup>rd</sup>, Elbow Branch Library switched their system over to the new network and is very pleased with the results. CAP funding (Community Access Program) was applied to cover the local start-up costs. In spite of its \$60.00 per month cost, this new and improved service will save each branch between \$7.00 and \$30.00 per month.

## **PROPOSED LOCAL LIBRARY BOARD POLICY CHANGES**

Several changes were approved to the Local Library Board Policy at the Fall Regional Board meeting. Perhaps the biggest is the requirement that local boards appoint a treasurer to assist the branch librarian with the financial reporting. It will also require that the board maintains good financial records. These records are to be checked over annually by a neutral third party. The board will also be responsible for the creation and maintenance of an annual branch budget.

## **FLU SHOTS FOR STAFF**

Once again this year we made flu shots available to permanent staff. We have found that, while it did not eliminate the 'flu, it did reduce in the amount of time being taken off by the staff to recover from the 'flu.

## **HEADQUARTERS REPAIRS**

Our ancient furnaces finally died. The oldest was original to the building (1957) while the newest furnace had been installed in the late 1980's. The building currently did not have an air exchange system other than that achieved by opening of the front door. Given the number of books stored here, that was not good. As a result, we replaced the furnace with a roof furnace, a basement furnace and new duct work. The staff are very pleased and the incidents of headaches and allergies has decreased.

# **Programming News**

## **TD Summer Reading Club – Blast Off**

This year's summer reading club was successful with 1,140 children registering for the program (585 children in 18 rural branches and 555 children at Moose Jaw Public Library). as compared to 1,131 children in 2004. All but one rural branch library participated in the reading club. The number of individual library programs and attendance at programs was down significantly from last year, with rural branches in particular offering more drop-in activities rather than structured programs. Children's performers The Wacky Wizard and "Prairie Dog" Doug were well-received in 14 rural branches with an average attendance of 32 children and adults per show.

This is the first year that Saskatchewan public libraries have participated in the national summer reading club coordinated by Library & Archives Canada and funded by TD Bank. The program materials (bookmarks, posters, activity books, stickers, astronaut cards and certificates) were colourful, well-designed and very popular. Library staff appreciated the comprehensive program manual and access to an excellent reading club website.

All the Palliser branch libraries and the staff and the young people who participated had a great time. Our thanks to the staff, volunteers and the following sponsors who helped make this year's summer reading program a success - The Toronto Dominion Bank Financial Group, SaskTel, Saskatchewan Culture, Saskatchewan Library Association, Saskatchewan Writers Guild, Saskatchewan Lotteries and local library system.

## Saskatchewan Library Week - Rediscover Saskatchewan @ your library

The libraries of the Palliser System celebrated library week in October by holding everything from fund-raisers to book contests. 17 of our 20 branches were active participants. Saskatchewan authors and read at Moose Jaw and at 9 rural branches. Funding assistance was provided by the Saskatchewan Writers Guild and the Canada Council. #### The 2005 Palliser Regional Library Executive Committee

#### 2005 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (April 28th, 2005) :

The 2004 Annual Report and the 2004 Auditor's statement were presented, discussed and final approval was given.

**James Taylor** (Moose Jaw) was re-elected the Chair. **Karen Basky** of Moose Jaw were elected for a 1 year term. **Vina Walker** of the resort village of Mistussinne was also elected for a 2 year term. There are 5 representatives on the Executive Committee from the City of Moose Jaw and 4 from the Rural Area.

**Dan McCarron** was appointed as auditor for 2005.

**Maxine Thurlow**, Retired Coronach Branch Librarian, was presented with her Service plaque.

**Tugaske** was awarded **Branch of the Year** honours for their hard work in outreach to the citizens of the RM and to the villages of Eyebrow and Tugaske, their innovative youth programming and for increasing circulation.

**The Levy Committee** reported that they had examined the weighting between the Villages / Towns / RMs with libraries and those without libraries and determined that it was in the best interest to leave the weighting as established under the bylaws. They reiterated that it is the responsibility of the local municipality to negotiate with its surroundings RMs and villages for additional funding if so desired.

#### Policy changes approved at the AGM:

- **The Mission Statement of the Palliser Regional Library** now reads as follows:  
*“Palliser Regional Library is designed to provide all people with equitable access to informational, cultural, recreational, and educational materials and programs. We strive to provide opportunities to enhance literacy and individual life long learning.”*
- **Executive Committee Policy**  
The names of the committees found in the Executive Policy section of the Policy manual were amended in keeping with the request from Provincial library. The New committees are now *Finance and Audit, Personnel and Compensation and Policy and Governance*

- **Performance Guidelines**

The following guidelines were added to Performance Guidelines in the policy manual:

- **Employees may not have children in the workplace for purposes of childcare during regular scheduled hours of work.**
- **Employees may not bring pets to the workplace during regular scheduled hours of work.**

## FALL REGIONAL BOARD MEETING (November 3rd, 2005)

The 2006 operating budget was adopted as proposed, but subject to the standard 2 conditions, ie: that the Moose Jaw Public Library's budget be adjusted to reflect the actual figures as passed by the City of Moose Jaw during their budgetary process and secondly, that the budget be adjusted to reflect the actual income/salaries which have resulted from funds raised for additional branch hours.

## LIBRARY LEVY INCREASE SET FOR 2006

The library levy rate for towns, and villages with a population over 2,000 and a library was set at \$16.02 per person. The library levy rate for towns, and villages with a population under 2,000 and a library was set at \$12.02 per person. The library levy rate for all other towns, villages and RM's was set at \$8.01 per person.
