2015 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING – May 15th 2015

Thirty-one designated representatives and fourteen staff/observers attended the meeting. Jan Smith, Director, presented the Auditor's Statement as prepared by Stark-Marsh of Swift Current and talked about the economic highlights of 2014. The audited statement was accepted.

Bethune Branch Library won **Branch of the Year**. Bethune has placed a strong emphasis on programming and community partnerships. They have recently partnered with the Southwest District for Culture, Recreation and Sport, K+S Potash, the Bethune Starstations Dance Club, the Arm River Colony and the Bethune Recreation Board. **Willow Bunch Branch** was awarded an **honourable mention** for their programming and community initiatives and they were one of the few branches whose circulation increased.

Janice Lamb, of Moose Jaw was elected **Chair**. **Jim Achtymichuk** of **Coronach** was elected and **Linda O'Connell** temporarily filled the second rural position and was formally elected at the **Fall Regional Board Meeting**. **David Howick** and **Matthew Zantingh** were elected to 2-year terms to represent the City of Moose Jaw.

In the Chair's Update Janice Lamb spoke about the advocacy work being carried out by Palliser and our presentations made to meetings with Deputy Minister Julie MacRae, and Assistant Deputy Minister Greg Millar

FALL REGIONAL BOARD MEETING - November 13th, 2015

The Palliser Regional Library Fall General Meeting was held on Friday November 13th. Twenty five designated representatives and six staff/observers attended the meeting.

The 2016 rural levy and the budget was passed. The new levy has been set as follows:

- Base Levy increase = \$0.30, new base levy \$13.30 per person
- Levy increase for towns and villages under 2,000 with a library = \$0.45, new base levy: \$19.95 per person
- Levy increase for towns over 2,000 (excluding Moose Jaw) = \$0.60, new Assiniboia levy: \$26.60 per person.
- The SILS Support Levy remained at \$0.375 per person.

After careful examination of the duties being performed by either of our Branch Librarian 1 or 2's, it was determined that there was no appreciable difference between the 2 jobs. Changes were made to the Rural Branch Standards Policy which eliminated the Branch Librarian 1 category. Now all rural branches, with the exception of Assiniboia, which is headed by a Library Tech, are headed by a Branch Librarian 2.

2015 AUDITED STATEMENT

Changes in reporting: In 2015 the Palliser “share” of the SILS audited statements was incorporated into our audited statement. The full audited statements can be found by clicking on the following tabs: the **Palliser Home Page** under “**About Palliser**” and “**Library Board**” and “**Audited Financial Statements**”.

We had a \$53,000 surplus in Headquarters. It was due to the December 14th arrival of funds which must be used to cover the 2016 set-up grant from Provincial Library for Centralized Interlibrary loans (\$52,138) and \$1,812 carry forward of the NNELs and Story Bird Grants. Moose Jaw saw a \$4,613 carryforward, Assiniboia carried forward \$5,641 due to underspending meetings and development costs, materials and staff turnover. The Local Branches carried forwarded \$12,048. \$7,714** was due to underspending of the Palliser book budget (**funded by the Province). Due to the merger of 2 of the largest book vendors, 20% of what was on order did not arrive.

ADVOCACY INITIATIVES

Provincial Funding

2015-2016 Provincial Budget: 0% funding increase for Headquarters operations. Although we budgeted a 0% in our budget for 2015 this hurts us enormously. This will mean that we have received a total increase in provincial funding of 1.54% or \$10,411 since 2011. In the same time period, inflation has gone up by 7.61%; Staff salaries by 10.22%; base rural library levies by 16.18%; City of Moose Jaw contribution 17.64% and the Provincial minimum wage itself has gone up by 12.88%.

Meeting with the Deputy Minister of Education:

The Chairs and Directors have had a meeting with the Assistant Deputy Minister **Greg Miller** and **Julie MacRae**, Deputy Minister of Education. The meeting concentrated on library participation in the Education Sector Strategic Plan and the 2 **Student First** hoshins: Saskatchewan Reads and Early Childhood literacy and school preparedness.

Meeting with the Standing Committee for Human Services:

Chair Janice Lamb and Jan Smith met with Standing Committee for Human Services on October 27th and brought forward our proposal for a pilot project in 5 rural branches, aimed at addressing the statistic that 43% of rural children are not ready to enter Grade One. How do you ensure that the 3 children in Wood Mountain

who live 1 hour away from their nearest school receive the same opportunities for pre-K as the children who live in Assiniboia? The committee listened to and like the idea and will be taking it forward to the Minister of Education for more scrutiny but there is the issue of budget and the oil & potash revenues. We will try to find partners to make it happen in 2016.

PROGRAMMING NEWS 2015



We are pleased to announce that we went live on Polaris on September 24th 2015. It has been an interesting ride. Many thanks to the SILS staff for keeping it all together and to Arwen Rudolph for helping write the provincial "Leap" manual for branch use. Funding for the conversion came from money set aside for the SILS server(s) replacement and contingency funds built into the SILS budget.

TD Summer Reading Club 2015



Play! *For the summer of 2015, we encouraged kids to **see reading as play**, and discover that the joyful, boundless and carefree feelings associated with play can just as easily be found in a great book. We wanted kids to have fun reading and share this joy, while they have the freedom to choose, explore, discover and play, any way they want.*

300 registered at Moose Jaw and read **1,220** books. Another **541** were registered in the **18** rural branches. **216** programs were held and were attended by **2,910** children.

Aboriginal Services and Programming



In 2015, Palliser received **\$14,987** to help us enhance our First Nations services and spent **\$15,072**. Palliser Regional Library System used this money to cover 4 basic expenses:

- salary,
- materials (books, online databases, DVD's),
- additional expenses for Aboriginal Storytelling Month,
- Aboriginal programming.

Aboriginal Programs Sponsored:

- **Bridging the Gap with Elder Gerry Stonechild** - Residential Schools – Moose Jaw Public Library
- **Aboriginal Storytelling with Elder Gerry Stonechild** on Oral Storytelling
- **Aboriginal Storytelling Month:** 17.5 sessions were sponsored by 10 branches and were attended by 470 students and staff. Sessions ranged from making bannock and muskeg tea to a session with the Mossbank high school students on the impact of residential schools.

Branch Workshops

2 Branch workshops were held. The August workshop concentrated on LEAP (Polaris) training. The October workshop went over issues that have arisen since Polaris went live as well as general housekeeping (Using Zinio (online e.g.: Good Housekeeping and Hockey News) , Palliser update, board training, Google Applications).

PSSD # 210 School Community Council (SCC)

School Community Council Presentation. On June 20th Palliser presented a workshop to the heads of the local Prairie South School Division's 43 local SCC's with information on sources of information or activities that will help the teacher /parent /student to be responsive to student needs and fulfill the Saskatchewan Reads Hoshin. We gave 4 sessions to 45 in attendance plus school senior staff. Hand-outs were revamped and oriented them towards the Pre-K to 12. The handouts have been provided in electronic format to all branches and to all RMs, Villages and Town for possible local distribution.

Moose Jaw - Southcentral Regional Intersectorial Committee (RIC)

In 2015 Palliser participated in the Five Hills Health Region **March Nutrition Month** program and **Day of Pink** –anti-bullying campaign of the Canadian Red Cross, as well as literacy initiatives and worked with the Multicultural Council in preparation for the arrival of the refugees. The RIC has been established to promote interagency co-operation and through shared processes and resources we can better support and facilitate the combined work of our departments, agencies and communities in providing a seamless educational and social service system to children and families.

Grants Received in 2015- 2016



Centralized Interlibrary Loans

In November 2014 Provincial Library announced a competition for Centralized Interlibrary Loans. Palliser was awarded the grant. There was initial set-up funding and an additional \$90,000 to cover the costs of a one year contract for service. In September we hired a second person for 25 hours per week to help cover the workload. We are currently averaging 650 requests per month.

Joan Heaton Estate – Our Plan to Use the Funds

The Estate of the late Joan Heaton generously left \$53,000 each to “the rural branches” of Palliser Regional Library and another \$53,000 to the Moose Jaw Library Branch. In the new library environment, programming and community service has become as important to libraries as books. It was decided to give every rural branch 12 hours per year of additional paid programming time. It is expected that this fund will cover us for the next 10-12 years.
